"At first, we were only going to be here for three days, then it turned into five weeks. Family House was so accommodating and flexible with our changes," Mike explained. Three weeks into their stay, Jim Mouzakis and his wife and Carla's sister, Shelley, flew in from California.

"Shelley and I wanted to give Mike and Carla a break from their long days in the hospital. I didn't know what to expect but I was so surprised at how comfortable I felt when I walked through the doors of Family House," Jim said. "Everyone, from staff to volunteers to the other guests, was extremely generous."

While their wives were at UPMC Presbyterian with their father, brothers-in-law Mike and Jim played cards in the lounge, talked to different guests and learned their stories. "Everyone was going through a hard time but they always asked how you were doing. You saw familiar faces and began to feel that sense of comfort that you can't get at a hotel," both Mike and Jim expressed.

After returning from a long stressful day at the hospital, Mike spotted a guitar in the lounge. He picked up the instrument and began playing in the back of the house, away from guests. Jim, a singer in a band in California, joined him and a small crowd began to form around them. "This was all very impromptu, just a way for us to pass the time and relax a bit," Jim explained. "We usually play together for our family so it just felt natural."

Their melodies erased the day's hardships and filled the air with calm and peacefulness. With such a positive reaction from fellow guests, they played a few more sessions during their stay. "It was something for us to do and it brought the house together. I enjoyed experimenting with our music and it provided a sense of normalcy for a period of time," shared Mike.

As Carla and Shelley continue to care for their father, the entire family expresses their appreciation for their time at Family House. "What this place does truly makes a powerful impact on its guests. I am definitely planning on making some kind of donation to make sure this service is available for others," Mike shared. "We are going to return the favor."

Now more than ever, affordability is key

Inflation and rising costs of living are impacting us all. The headlines are unavoidable, and many of us feel the squeeze on our personal budgets.

For families managing medical care away from home, finding financial balance is much more challenging with the many unanticipated costs. Every penny counts. That is why Family House's affordable lodging and additional amenities make a huge difference for the families who rely on our services.


The economic benefit of Family House isn't just our nonprofit rate, offered at a fraction of the cost of Pittsburgh-area hotels. Guests receive a whole host of added benefits to reduce the economic burden of medical care.

Communal pantries and refrigerators are kept well-stocked with healthy food options from generous donors in the community. Groups from local corporations, universities, churches, and other organizations regularly prepare and serve warm dinners for guests. Transportation to and from the hospital is and will always be free. And each morning, Family House guests wake to a complimentary breakfast—made available seven days a week!

For families with increased financial need, Family Assistance grants are available to reduce room rates. Recently, the Family Assistance program has expanded its eligibility to reach even more families, as patients and their caregivers are increasingly strained by managing both health and financial challenges.

The recent consolidation of Family House under one roof ensures the financial resource of this institution will remain available for families long into the future.

We are especially grateful for generous and loyal donors and volunteers. Without them, families in need of affordable options would not be able to find Family House. We thank each person who lifts up this mission.

The Family House volunteer program truly is the **backbone of the organization**. Because of volunteers, Family House provides the warmth of a homelike environment. Two long-time house volunteers, Connie Ochs and Mary Ann Tataryzn, offer insight on their experience and how it feels to be under one roof.



Connie Ochs began her volunteer journey ten years ago as a floater picking up shifts in each of the three former locations.

"I loved being a floater. I got to interact with the staff at all locations and I could pick up shifts when they were convenient for me."

While some duties have changed, Connie enjoys working at the new house. She is on a new committee to create programming for guests.

"We've started a baking program once a week and guests really love it. Some will help us with the baking, others will gather and start conversations with each other. It's a great way to get guests to mingle and forget, for a few moments, about their day."

The best part of volunteering for Connie is the guest engagement. Whether giving tours, answering questions, or reminding guests where things are located, someone always needs her help.

"I am excited to come into this new, beautiful location. I know that my work alleviates stressors for both guests and staff alike. Volunteering at Family House has given me a better appreciation for what I have. I'm also amazed at how graceful guests are to each other. There really is a strong support system here and I feel proud to be a part of it." •



Mary Ann Tataryzn decided to become a house volunteer nearly nine years ago after her sister invited her to cook a meal for guests.

"As soon as I walked into the house, I knew this was the place for me. I was looking for a new way to spend my time after retiring from teaching and volunteering at Family House was the right fit."

When Mary Ann walks into Family House for her shift, she is ready to get to work. She heads to the kitchen area to clean out leftover items in the individual cubbies and to individually wrap baked good donations. Then it's off to guest rooms to ensure they are prepared for check-in.

"I'm truly enjoying the new house and keeping busy during my shift. I am really impressed with how the new house feels like a Family House. It's a larger space but it still feels like someone's home."

Each floor is uniquely themed with its own lounge space, perfect for moments when guests want peace and quiet.

"I love that there are various ways for guests to interact with each other. My favorite space is the kitchen because I see so many people cooking, chatting, and making friendships. It reminds me of what happens in my own home."

For Mary Ann, being able to make a difference, no matter how big or small, is the reason she continues her volunteering.



Under One Roof: The Campaign for Family House has surpassed 85% of its \$16 million goal.

Two recent leadership gifts brought total capital campaign commitments to \$13.7 million. In August, Family House received a \$500,000 grant from Annapolis, MD-based Phillips Charitable Foundation. And in September, Emeritus Board Member Howard "Hoddy" Hanna III and the Hanna Family pledged their continued support for Family House with a substantial campaign gift.
