In the summer of 1979, the airwaves pulsed with the infectious beats of Sister Sledge's "We Are Family" as disco fever swept the nation. Little did anyone know that this catchy tune would become more than just a chart-topper: it would weave itself into the fabric of baseball history. The Pittsburgh Pirates, riding on the waves of this anthem, adopted it as their team song during their journey to clinch the 1979 World Series Championship. But beyond the realm of sports, the Pirates and this iconic song played a pivotal role in the establishment of the first Family House in Pittsburgh.

As the Pirates were basking in their triumph, initial discussions were being conducted to create a haven for families facing medical challenges in Pittsburgh. In 1981, the founders of Family House, alongside representatives from the Pirates organization, convened to shape the vision of providing a "home away from home" for patients and their loved ones. The Pirates pledged crucial seed funding to kickstart the initiative, aligning perfectly with the ethos encapsulated in the song "We Are Family."

Fast forward nearly four decades, and Family House continues to embody the spirit of compassion and support that inspired its inception. As we celebrate Family House's 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary, we extend our heartfelt gratitude to the Pittsburgh Pirates for their contribution to our inception and history, reminding us that in the journey of healing, we are all part of one big family.

## Family House Ruby Jubilee Gala

The Family House *Ruby Jubilee Gala*, held on March 23, was a resounding success, capping a milestone 40<sup>th</sup> year for our organization.

The evening was an elegant affair as guests, adorned in their finest cocktail attire, gathered to support our mission. Our annual spring fundraiser proved to be more than iust a night of celebration – attendees participated in a variety of giving opportunities, including a silent auction, prize package raffle, and our signature gifting board. The Ruby Jubilee Gala was a true testament to the unwavering generosity of the Family House community. The Gala raised more than \$205,000-the highest-grossing spring fundraiser hosted by Family House over the past 15 years. All Gala proceeds will make a significant impact in providing comfort, care, and support to patients and their families, ensuring that no one faces the financial and emotional challenges of a medical crisis alone.



A highlight of this year's Gala was the introduction of the *Cocktails for a Cause Reception*, a new feature designed to engage young professionals in volunteerism and giving opportunities at Family House. The Reception provided a platform for the next generation of Family House supporters to learn about the vital work being done by the organization and explore ways to get involved.

Perhaps the most memorable portion of the evening was shared by the Gala's Mission Moment guest speaker, Beth Filer. Ms. Filer gave a heartfelt and compelling retelling of her and her family's experience with Family House while her husband, Mark Filer, was hospitalized in UPMC Shadyside. During the closing of her remarks, Ms. Filer also announced to Gala attendees that donations raised from her own fundraising efforts exceeded \$22,000 in gifts from family and friends throughout her community in support of Family House's mission.
